





English – Reading

- During Reception and Key Stage 1 children are learning to read. By Key Stage 2 children begin to read to learn
- Children can now use their reading skills to support learning in other subjects
- Reading teaching focuses on vocabulary and comprehension skills
- Daily whole class reading sessions
- Quality texts, range of genres








English - Reading

Some children may still be consolidating their phonic skills:

- Targeted phonic support in school 'Rapid Catch Up'
- Combines phonic teaching and reading practise sessions to develop fluency, prosody and comprehension
- Phonetically decodable books



English – Reading books

Once children have mastered phonetic code and can read fluently with expression they can move on to free readers & gem readers.

Gem readers:

- developed to provide children with age appropriate and enticing books to read
- Year 3 gem readers are Emerald books
- Certificates for reading 10/20/30 books







English – Reading



Reading enjoyment has been reported as more important for children's educational success than their family's socio-economic status.

Regularly reading stories or novels outside of school is associated with higher scores in reading assessments.

Reading for pleasure can improve general knowledge and help with other subject areas.


Reading for pleasure has emotional benefits.

- We want every child to read every night.
- 10 -15 minutes

Help at home

- It can be a mixture of reading activities - child reading, adult reading to the child, listening to an audiobook, reading a comic etc.
- Record in Weekly diary

English – Writing



- Varied texts linked to projects build connections
- Learn whole or sections of texts and use this to create our own
- Develop an understanding of new vocabulary
- Write a wide range of genres
- Spelling pattern taught in class and practiced at home
- Encourage the children to choose a writing task linked to their project home learning




